It is understood that under no circumstances shall MJ Farms, Olds Agricultural Society, the owners, management, tournament committee, or any of its staff or agents be liable for any loss, damages, claims or costs as a result of MJ Farms, the owners, management, tournament committee, or any of its staff or agents, negligence, and that you agree to save harmless MJ Farms, Olds Agricultural Society, the owners, management, tournament committee, and any of its staff or agents, from and against any and all liability arising out of any such loss, damages, claims or costs.

Prizes

Ribbons will be awarded to sixth place in all classes. Championship and Reserve Championships will be awarded for each full division. Additional awards and prizes and special awards will be presented throughout the tournament. Stake pay-outs based on 60% of class fees and paid out only on classes with 5 entries by Friday August 13. Stake pay-outs to fifth.

The management committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered in the rules and to correct any errors or make alterations that may be necessary in the prize list. The management committee reserves the right to remove any groom, trainer, owner, manager, or rider from the tournament without compensation. Any acts of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials by the owner, rider, manager, trainer, or groom shall disqualify them from further competition in the tournament and the owner shall forfeit all fees. Inhumane treatment of a horse such as polling will not be tolerated. Violation of this rule will result in immediate disqualification, and forfeiture of the fees. In the case of disqualification, the horse winning the succeeding prize shall receive the prize of the disqualified horse and the other prizes will be adjusted accordingly. Courses will be posted in the hitching ring one half hour prior to the start of each class. An approved hard hat with a properly secured and fastened harness is compulsory for all competitors while riding anywhere on the tournament grounds. Horses shall be allowed to compete not to be judged or "Hors Concours" with permission from the management only in the jumper ring. Anyone exhibiting dangerous or unsportsmanlike behavior may, at the discretion of the tournament committee, be expelled from the grounds and forfeit fees.

Entry Procedure

1. For each horse entered a check or visa number **MUST** accompany the completed entry form.
2. Entry forms that are not completely filled out will be charged a \$10 penalty fee.
3. Number will not be issued without a cheque to cover the balance of the entries.
4. Late entry forms received after the closing date will be charged a late fee of \$25.00. Post entries (entered on the first day of the show or later) will be assessed a fee of \$25.00.
5. N.S.F. Cheques will result in an additional \$35 service fee.

Refunds

Exhibitors canceling their entries before the closing date will be issued a refund in full. Those received after the closing date of entries but prior to the start of the tournament, shall, upon presentation of a valid veterinarian certificate, forfeit their stall and office fees, all other fees will be refunded. Non veterinarian scratches will not be refunded after the closing date.

Management

The tournament management reserves the right to limit entries in any division and to refuse or decline any entry without being liable for compensation or damages. Ties for jumper championships will be decided by a coin toss. Ties for hunter championships will be awarded to the rider receiving the most points in classes over fences.

Memberships

All riders, owners and trainers must be a Bronze level member of Equine Canada or higher. New Equine Canada memberships cannot be sold at the show, only temporary memberships at the cost of \$30. All riders, owners and trainers must also be members of the CEDL/AHHS to compete at this competition. New CEDL/AHHS memberships can be purchased at the tournament office.

Passports

Passports are not required for Bronze level EC sanctioned competitions.

Drug Fees

A \$3.50 Drug Fee will be collected for every horse entered in an Equine Canada Bronze tournament.

CEDL/AHHS Levy

All competitors, owners and trainers will be required to be a member of the Canadian Equestrian Development League/Alberta Hunter Horse Society. Memberships can be purchased at the tournament office. This levy helps to fund Horse and Rider Development programs that will directly benefit Alberta athletes.

Schooling & Warm up Rules

All EC sanctioned competitions must use current FEI schooling rules as listed. Refer to Chapter 9, FEI Rules, Article 244 Exercise AND SCHOOLING AREAS AND PRACTISE OBSTACLES. These rules pertain to all hunter, equitation and jumper classes and divisions at all EC sanctioned competitions. Rapping is forbidden, Article A516 and FEI Article 243.

Stabling

Stabling will be available Friday noon to Sunday. Absolutely NO STALL CHANGES allowed without the approval of the

show office and show manager. Permanent Stalls are available for a charge of \$85 Day Stalls are available at a charge of \$55 per stall for the duration of the show times each day. Day stalls do not include overnight.

Feed & Bedding

Stalls are pre-bedded with shavings. No other hay or bedding are available for sale at show. Additional shavings may be purchased at UFA Coop.

Dogs

All dogs must be on a leash on the show grounds. There are absolutely no dogs in schooling area or show arenas at any time.

Non Rated Hunter Divisions

2'6" Low & Schooling Hunter

Open to all horses, ponies and riders. Horses will not jog.

2'9" Low & Schooling Hunter

Open to all horses, ponies and riders. Horses will not jog.

3'0" Low Hunter

Open to all horses, ponies and riders. Horses will not jog.

Low Pony Hunter

Open to all ponies and riders. Ponies will not jog.

(Heights will be adjusted accordingly to size of pony)

Baby Green Hunter 2'6"

Open to horses or ponies that have not shown over a course of fences at any show or event prior to January 1st of the current year. Fences may be jumped at a trot or canter. Cross entry only into competitions with fences at 2'6 or under.

Model Hunter under 16 HH

Model Hunter 16 HH& over

Developing Riders Tour Competition Specifications

A developing rider is a rider that has not jumped higher than 2'9 at any competition up to and including the 2010 season.

Trot X-Rail Hunter

Open to developing and BRAVE riders only. Horses will not jog. No horse & rider combination cross entry other the X-rail classes classes 200 u/s, 201 over fences

X-Rail Hunter

Open to developing and BRAVE riders only. Horses will not jog. No horse & rider combination cross entry will any competitions over 2'0. classes 202 u/s 203

2'0 Developing Hunter

Open to developing and BRAVE riders only. Horses will not jog. No horse & rider combination cross entry will any competitions over 2'3.

Short Stirrup Pony Hunter 2'3

This division is designed for beginner riders on ponies. No oxers. Ponies will not jog. No horse & rider combination cross entry will any competitions over 2'6.

Open to all horses, ponies and riders. Horses will not jog.

2'9" Schooling Hunter

Open to all horses, ponies and riders. Horses will not jog.

2'9" Modified Hunter

Open to all horses and riders. Horses will not jog.

Modified Child/Adult 2'9"

Open to all Junior and Amateur Riders. No cross entry to Modified Hunter 3'3 or Jr/Am Hunter 3'6 at same show.

Short/Long Stirrup/Developing/Brave Hunter 2'3

Horses will not jog. No horse & rider combination cross entry will any competitions over 2'6.

Pre Child/Adult Hunter 2'6

Horses will not jog. No horse & rider combination cross entry will any competitions over 2'9.

Young Horse Hunter Development Series

Horses will be judged 40% under saddle, 60% over fences, (20% of over fences score will be Conformation to be judged during the jog after the final over fences classes. Standard Figure eight course will be used.

Young Horse Jumper Series

Horses will be judged on jumping technique, balance, athletic ability, ride ability, and apparent suitability for future success in the jumper division. Scored out of 100, 0.5 points for each commenced second over the time allowed. Subtract 4 points for each knock down or refusal, second refusal incurs elimination. Table A one round with a time allowed. No jump-off.
